

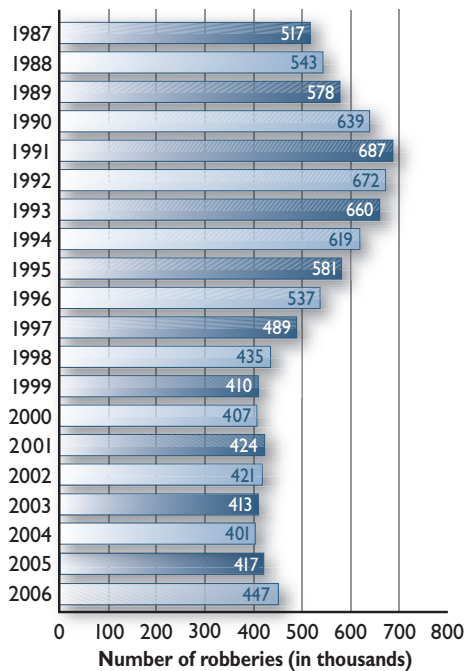

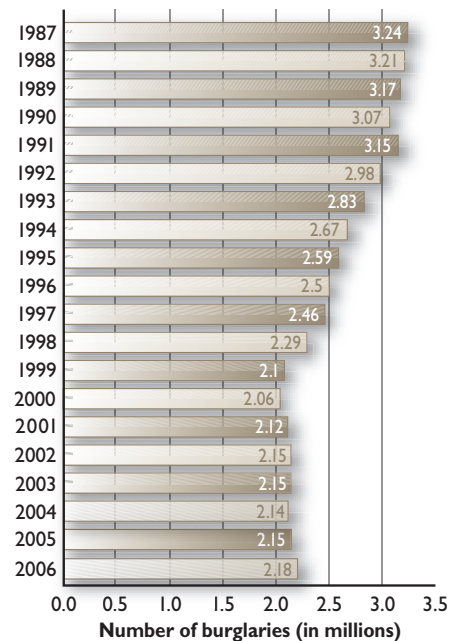
Robberies in the United States



The estimated number of robberies in 2006 increased 7.2 percent from the 2005 data. Incidents of robbery increased in cities and nonsuburban communities 10.4 percent and 7.2 percent, respectively. A majority of robberies (44.5 percent) were committed on streets or highways, while firearms were used in 42.2 percent of all reported robberies. The average dollar value of property stolen per robbery offenses was \$1,268. Bank robbery had the highest average dollar value taken at \$4,330 per offense.

Burglaries in the United States



The estimated number of burglaries increased slightly — 1.3 percent — compared with 2005 data. Burglary accounted for 21.9 percent of the estimated number of property crimes committed in 2006. The average dollar loss per burglary offenses in 2006 was \$1,834. Of all burglary offenses in 2006, 66.2 percent were of residential structures. A preponderance (63.1 percent) of residential burglaries in 2006 for which time of occurrence was known, took place during the day. Among burglaries of nonresidential structures when time of occurrence was known, 56.7 occurred at night.
